## **Career Guidance and Counseling in the Training Units of the Technical and Vocational Training Corporation: Reality and Aspirations**

### **Abstract:**

The current study aimed to identify the reality of (reality - hoped) vocational guidance and counseling in the training units of the Technical and Vocational Training corporation from the point of view of the study participants. The sample of study consisted (1982) trainees and trainees in a preliminary way, and (398) trainers were selected to answer their questionnaire by (222) male trainers and (176) female trainers, and a sample of (32) male and female guides has been selected, with (13) male and (19) female guides.

In order to achieve the objectives of the study, the questionnaire to measure the reality of career guidance and counseling in technical colleges and industrial institutes was prepared from the viewpoint of trainees, trainers, trainers, and guides, and face to face interviews to identify the reality and aspiration of career guidance from the viewpoint of trainees, trainers and guides.

The results of the study found that the trainees' responses to the opportunities were in a moderate degree. As for the difficulties faced by the trainee in the counseling services, they were also resolved with a medium degree, and with regard to the trainees' responses to the perceptions of the institution, society and the trainee itself, it was with a moderate degree. The study indicated that the trainers' responses to the opportunities and difficulties were of a medium degree, and with regard to the perceptions that belong to the institution, the perceptions about professional counseling were of a medium degree, as for the perceptions that belong to the community and the trainer himself, the answers with a high

degree, and the results of the study also found that the guides' responses to Opportunities and obstacles were to a high degree, and with regard to the counselors' responses to the perceptions that belong to the institution, society, and the guides themselves, it was high.
